ISCE Scholars	The aim of this signature program is to provide interdisciplinary faculty teams with support for developing grant proposals, in new or existing areas in the social sciences, that align with one of ISCE's four thematic areas. The expectation is that proposals will lead to submission of an external grant application. Approximately 6-8 proposals of up to \$30,000 each are funded each year. Unsolicited Requests	ISCE accepts unsolicited proposals from full-time faculty anytime during the calendar year for projects that require a rapid response to an event, small feasibility studies and interdisciplinary team building that enable faculty to be more competitive for applications for external funding. Requests typically range from \$3,500-\$7,500. Restricted Microdata Research	Virginia Tech has an agreement with the Georgetown Federal Statistical Research Data Center through 2024 to allow four approved projects access to restricted federal microdata. To assist faculty who receive approval for a project, ISCE will provide up to \$5,000 to help cover the costs of implementing the project. ISCE PREP Program	The aim of this two-semester cohort-based program is to support social science faculty who are new to preparing proposals for extramural funding, or who have not served as PI for a successful proposal. Participants receive intensive mentoring and up to \$10,000 to support proposal development and preliminary research activities. Co-Sponsored Initiatives and Partnerships	An ongoing partnership between ISCE and the Global Change Center (GCC) provides funding of up to \$30,000 for interdisciplinary projects that address social aspects of major global change issues and intend to seek external funding. Projects must include faculty affiliated with the GCC and a Virginia Tech social scientist. Proposals are due annually each Spring. ISCE often partners with the other Virginia Tech Research Investment Institutes, Centers and Colleges to offer additional funding opportunities that are announced via the ISCE website and ISCE News Flash as funding becomes available.
